ANNUAL ACTIVITY REPORT JANUARY – DECEMBER 2008**

Class Hrs. During 2008 we provided a 15,240 student class hours this represents a 25% increase over 2007.

Age Through classes and other activities we serve 912 students, 85 of them are children between 1 and 5 years old, 55 are in the range 6 to 17 years old and 527 are over 18 years old. Average of adults is 37 yrs old

Participation 65% of these students have been participating in our programs 3 to 4 years and 35% were new students on 2008.

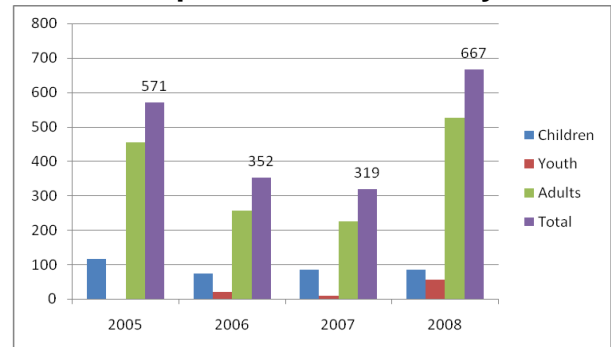
Residence Participants live in 11 different cities, 92% lives in Yakima, of which 53% live in East Yakima.

Origin 5 countries are represented, 97% are from twenty-three state of Mexico, and the majority is from Michoacán 29% and Jalisco 19%.

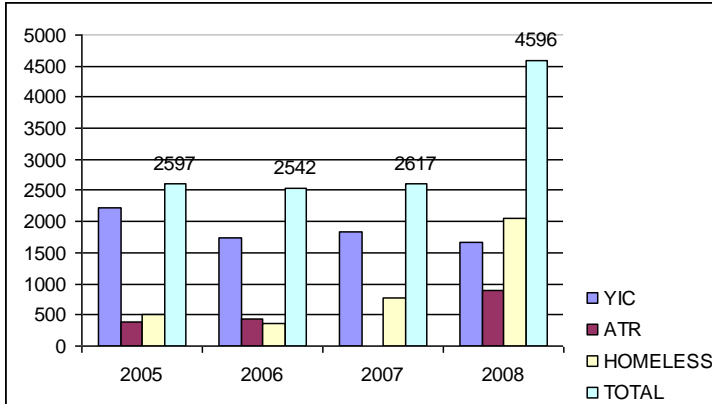
Major Accomplishments 2008

During 2008 we helped 1,821 unduplicated individuals, 795 of them were identified as homeless, 68% male and 32% female from 13 different locations of the Yakima Valley 90% from Yakima. 57% are White, 23% Hispanic, 13% Native American and 7% other ethnicities.
