Class Hours During 2009 we provided a 19,560 student class hours this represents a 29% increase over 2008.

Age Through classes and other activities 518 students were served, 115 were children ages 1 -5 years, 60 were between 6 to 17 years old and 343 were over age 18. Average adult age was 37 years old.

Participation 52% of students have been participating in our programs 3 to 4 years and 48% were new students in 2009.

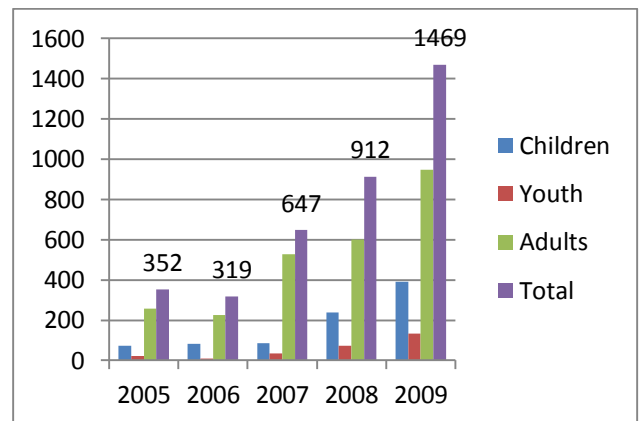
Residence Participants live in 9 different cities, 88% lives in Yakima, of which 46% live in East Yakima.

Origin Six countries are represented, 90% are from twenty-one states of Mexico, the majority are from Michoacán 35% and Jalisco 16%.

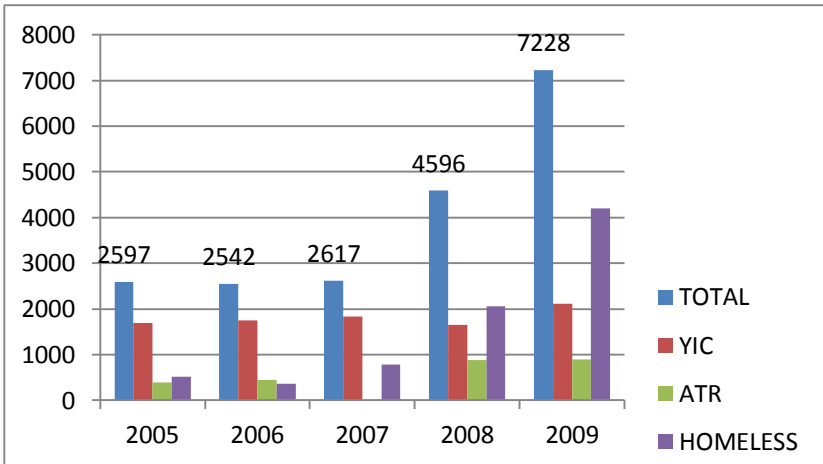
Major Accomplishments 2009

We provided **7,228 units of services** to and estimated **10,842 people** at a cost of **\$109,910** during 2009, this represents 88% increase in services over last year.
