
Quick Facts

- **100%** of students are motivated to cultivate education and skills for success.



Last December, Adriana shared her gratitude for La Casa Hogar’s U.S. Citizenship classes, but she hadn’t obtained her citizenship... yet. Now, Adriana has an update to share with you...



“When I have a goal, I focus on it, and I accomplish it...always.”

My goal was to become a citizen because I wanted to vote... in the U.S. if a person does not vote, her voice is not heard, and I wanted my voice to be heard. I went to La Casa to sign up for citizenship classes in Yakima.

All the students and the teacher welcomed me. I committed to attend every class, which meant finding childcare for my children and making time to study at home. I knew all my hard work would be worth it at the end.

“I knew the effort I had put in to prepare, so I felt confident in myself.”

When I was ready, La Casa Hogar supported me to complete my citizenship (N400) application which I submitted this past winter. I was scared because the interview was in English and my first language is Spanish. But I knew I was prepared, so I felt confident in myself. The community at La Casa Hogar believed in me too; everyone reminded me of my dedication and gave me encouragement. So I went into that interview, and this winter, **I became a U.S. Citizen.**

Now that I am a U.S. Citizen, I plan to vote. I plan to take pre-GED classes and continue with English classes. I want to be an example for my family, my children and for other students who want to make the U.S. their home. It is powerful when you really want to accomplish something. *Querer es poder. Si yo pude hacerlo, otros también pueden lograrlo.* Desire is power. If I can do it, others can do it too.
