### *The year in review...*

Thank you community! 2004 has been an amazing year for Yakima Interfaith Coalition La Casa Hogar. We have gained many new friends, partners in service and ministry. Our story and the stories of those we serve has touched many new hearts. The results, well, they're in the miracle department! New partners and relationships enhance services providing students more opportunities to achieve their goals. Parents see their children becoming ready for school. One mother proclaiming an exciting discovery said, "I didn't realize my child was so smart!" Because of our partnerships with local businesses, we were able to introduce to the community our Spanish immersion program; over 60 students participated. Our classes and facility are at maximum capacity. In our emergency services program, every afternoon many gather in our living room for a bit of respite from the street. We continue to see increased requests for services, particularly among the homeless.

Our board of directors this past year increased in size from 12 to a maximum of 18 members. They are seeking other leaders to join them in pursuit of our mission. They have decided to purchase our home which is the cornerstone of our organization and its future. Our new mission statement expresses it all. *As an expression of faith, our home nurtures strong communities... one person at a time.* We believe our home and family of services is a great investment.
